My own darling Hope, It seems grimly appropriate that people of our personasion should still be perseented by the direst of all penalties - separation from each other - at this Christmas reason. For it is we who hold the most un-compromisingly to the idea that in Minersal Goodwill ties the only practical hope of making a happin world, and this idea certainly seems tatally apposed to the swagger ing bragadois of the sentiment "God who made the night, Make the mighter get." I thought till recently that I had shed my last illusions about British dignity, but the extraordinary nansea that overcomes me whenever I think of Haig's order that German invitians should salute Butish officers reminds me how acute is my longing " retain a ting remnant of respect for England. The transcendant pettiness of the odions thing.
